

2019 Marching Saints Disney World Trip Chaperone Information

Chaperoning the Marching Saints trip to Disney World is a wonderful experience that allows you to see our students perform for one of the largest audiences many of them will ever be in front of. It is also a great way to get to know our students and see them having fun in a different environment. And you get to go to Disney World, too! What could be better?

Here is a list of chaperone duties on our trip:

- Ride the buses with the students both to and from Disney World (it's a lot of fun--really)
- Supervise and/or assist with loading luggage and instruments on buses
- One chaperone on each bus (the bus captain) will oversee bus attendance at all stops, and morning and evening loading in Orlando
- Be willing to share your cell phone number with your group of 12-16 students
- Be the primary contact person for the students in your group in case of emergency
- Pass along necessary student information to one of the directors as needed
- Spend each day in the specified park so students can find you if needed (you do not need to travel in a group with your students)
- Supervise students in the hotel (there will be over-night security for our group so no all-nighters are needed)
- If a student is sick and needs to remain at the hotel for a day instead of going to the parks, a chaperone or chaperone team will be needed to stay at the hotel to periodically check on the student and be a contact for the student (chaperone duties are adjusted as needed to accommodate all students)
- Help supervise all St. Charles East students on the trip as needed
- Assist with check-out for students leaving the trip early or not traveling back with us
- Have fun!!

Chaperones pay the same amount for the trip as the students, but have double occupancy rooms as opposed to quad occupancy. Chaperones may choose a single room option for an additional cost.
